Amplifying Youth-Driven Climate Solutions: The Impact of Education and Green Skills in Kyrgyzstan

Context

In the face of climate change, young people around the world are at the forefront of innovative and traditional solutions to adapt to climate change. *The preservation of the Kyrgyz aboriginal horse, the creation of artificial glaciers, the genetic preservation of unique varieties of apple trees are just some of the climate solutions that are initiated by young people in the Kyrgyz Republic.*

However, it is still crucial to assess how effectively the climate process in the Kyrgyz Republic engages young people, as the share of young people in civic participation is only 0.51 percent (UNICEF).

The Kyrgyz Republic is working in partnership with <u>UN CC Learn</u> to advance solutions to this problem and create a strategy aimed at enhancing individual and institutional skills for green development. This work is interlinked with major national initiatives, such as the ratification of the Paris Agreement and the government's commitments to strengthen the country's NDCs, the development of the National Adaptation Plan, as well as the adoption of the National Green Economy Program, an economy that recognizes the need for competencies for green development in the country.

The Kyrgyz Republic presented its National Strategy for Climate Change Education in April 2021. *The Comprehensive Climate Change Education Action Plan* aims to increase the capacity of decision-makers, integrate climate education at all levels, and ensure public access and engagement of young people to climate issues.

The session is dedicated to the presentation of the UNCC Learn strategy in the Kyrgyz Republic, as well as the presentation of youth climate cases. It also fosters reflection, exchange of experiences and replication of initiatives in Central Asia and globally.

The final art session is designed to draw attention to the importance of climate education and action for the well-being of local communities and the preservation of mountain ecosystems through art. Participants can color a snow leopard canvas and express their commitment to action.
