Rationale and Objectives of the meeting

One of the key objectives of the Collaborative Adaptation Research Initiative in Africa and Asia is to ensure that high quality research is used by key stakeholders, within communities or by relevant policy-makers. In order to achieve this, the CARIAA program aims to build synergies across consortia, in particular by promoting learning and exchanges on emerging research themes of common interest; and encouraging new ways to look at those themes and to communicate research results.

By the end of Year 1, consortia and the CARIAA team met in Nairobi for the first Annual Learning Review, focusing on ways to make Research-into-Use (RiU) more effective, and highlighting a series of needs and steps for the way forward.

Main Objective of the Second Annual Learning Review

To agree on common themes for research, research uptake and synthesis where innovative approaches by consortia have the potential to be taken to scale and to have an impact on vulnerability reduction in the CARIAA hotspots; and to understand how CARIAA can help to better unlock consortia's potential on such themes.

We hope to achieve this objective in a three-day workshop bringing together a representative number of consortia key team members and students, as well as selected external speakers, facilitators with a deep knowledge of the CARIAA program, and members from CARIAA's advisory committee.

The third and last day will be dedicated to a guided discussion on progress against the CARIAA Learning Framework.

We believe that, as consortia reach their mature phase and Working Groups progress at different rhythms, the Second Annual Learning Review comes at the right moment (not too soon to share learning, not too late to address challenges) in time to share experience on the successes and challenges met by Working Groups, other cross-consortia work or on emerging themes of common interest; and agree on ideas on how to advance on them.

Facilitators

The workshop will be facilitated by Blane Harvey, Pete Cranston, and Marissa van Epp, three consultants from Euforic Services Ltd. The three team members are already familiar with CARIAA. Euforic is a UK-based consultancy company supporting development organizations with communications, knowledge management, digital strategy and facilitation.
